- 3,500 face-to-face interviews conducted by PSB
- Arab youth in the age group of 18-24 years
- Sample split 50:50 male/female
- 16 countries
 - GCC: Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and UAE
 - Levant: Jordan, Iraq, Lebanon and Palestine
 - North Africa: Algeria, Egypt, Libya, Morocco and Tunisia
 - Other: Yemen










TIMELINE (JANUARY 2013 - JANUARY 2014)








Which of the following is closest to your view?
















VALUES AND BELIEFS BY COUNTRY

- Traditional values are outdated and belong in the past. I am keen to embrace modern values and beliefs.












LIFE INFLUENCES

How far would you say each of the following influence you and your outlook on life? (% Very influential)






















CONFIDENCE IN NATIONAL GOVERNMENTS' ABILITIES

How confident are you in your national governments' abilities to deal with the following issues?












IMPACT OF THE ARAB SPRING








CONCERN ABOUT KEY ISSUES








CONCERN ABOUT THE RISING COST OF LIVING BY COUNTRY

How concerned would you say you are about the rising cost of living?








CONCERN ABOUT UNEMPLOYMENT BY COUNTRY

How concerned would you say you are about each of the following issues?




















BIGGEST OBSTACLES FACING THE MIDDLE EAST








ENTREPRENEURSHIP BY COUNTRY






WORK SECTOR PREFERENCE-GCC/NON-GCC SPLIT

(% Private sector and % Government sector)


















MODEL NATIONS








DESIRED COUNTRY TO EMULATE








COUNTRY'S BIGGEST ALLIES






BIGGEST ALLIES-GCC/NON-GCC SPLIT








HEALTH ISSUES

Which of the following health issues concerns you most?










HEALTHCARE SERVICES-GCC/NON-GCC SPLIT

In the last year do you feel that the healthcare in your country has...?


















ENERGY SUBSIDIES BY COUNTRY








BIGGEST CHALLENGE FACING THE MIDDLE EAST

Which of the following would you say is the biggest challenge facing the Middle East today?

















Where do you get your news?










TRUSTED NEWS SOURCES
